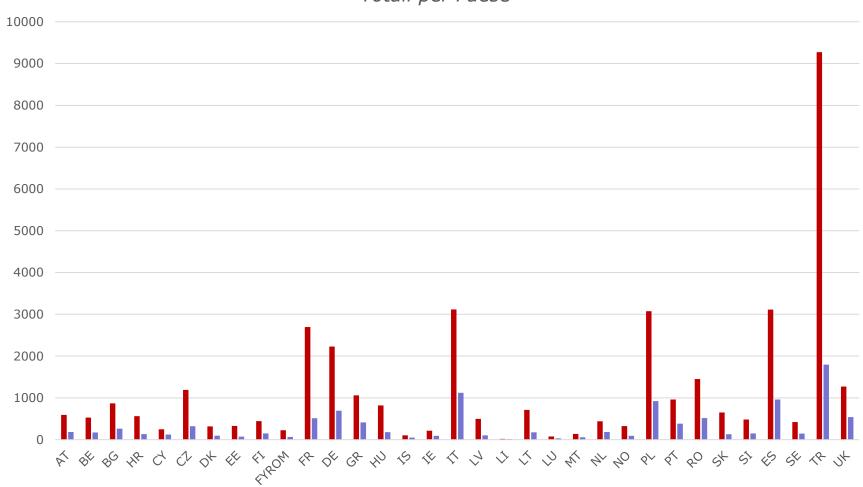

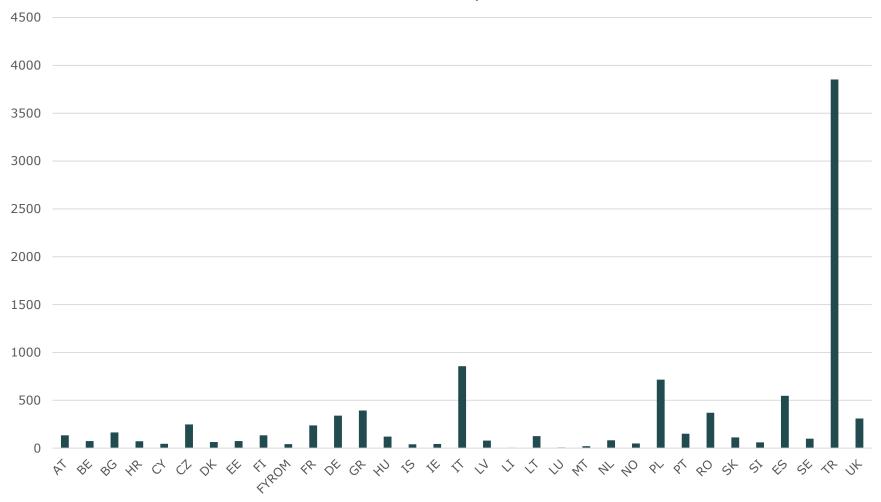


Call 2016 - Candidature pervenute Totali per Paese



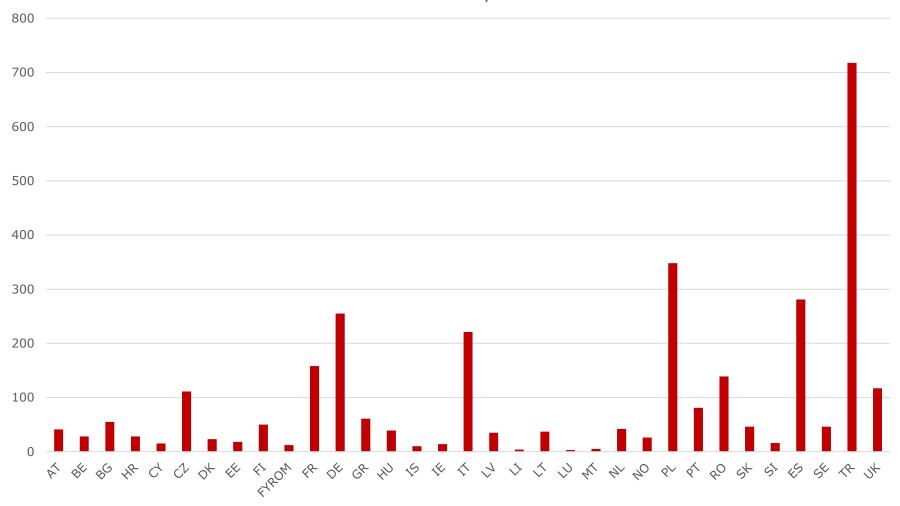


Call 2016 - Candidature pervenute KA101



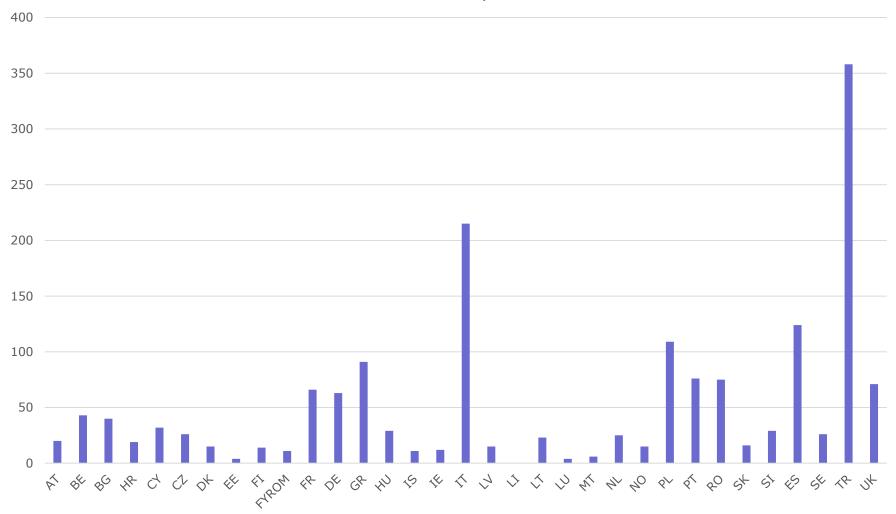

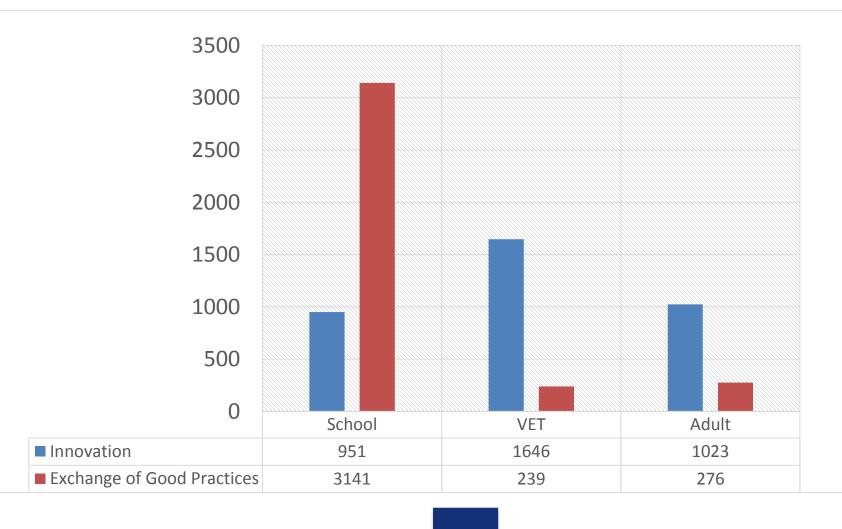
